Worried by the tragic consequences of nuclear testing, and the conviction that nuclear disarmament and the total elimination of nuclear weapons are the only absolute guarantee against the use or threat of nuclear weapons, the United Nations General Assembly designated **September 26 as the "International Day for the Total Elimination of Nuclear Weapons"**. This Day provides an occasion for the world community to reaffirm its commitment to global nuclear disarmament as a high priority.

The United States is spending an estimated \$1 trillion over thirty years to rebuild its nuclear weapons infrastructure, including new submarines, bombers and missiles. This contradicts President Obama's commitment to total elimination of nuclear weapons pledged in his Prague speech, and only serves to stimulate proliferation, and scuttle efforts toward disarmament.
